

Volunteer Positions Museum

The Cade Museum for Creativity & Invention has a variety of volunteer positions for anyone interested in getting involved, including but not limited to the following:

Creativity Lab Assistant – Creativity Lab Assistants act as a set of helping hands to the education team in the Creativity Lab, the Cade Museum’s lab where science, art, and history intersect. These volunteers enjoy interacting with people and showing them what there is to do in the Creativity Lab. Volunteers must feel comfortable interacting with the public and sharing the activities and experiments in the Creativity Lab as well as the science concepts behind them.

Fab Lab Assistant – Fab Lab Assistants act as a set of helping hands to the education team in the Fab Lab, the Cade Museum’s technology and engineering lab. These volunteers are interested in technology and learning, enjoy interacting with people and showing them what there is to do in the Fab Lab, and are often responsible for guiding guests through a specified activity. Volunteers must feel comfortable interacting with the public and sharing the activities in the Fab Lab.

Little Sparks Assistant (Thursday and Saturday mornings only) – Little Sparks volunteers assist the education team with Little Sparks, our STEAM learning program for preschoolers. Volunteers will assist with hands-on, educational activities that change weekly and enjoy working with children under the age of 5.

Traveling Exhibit Assistant – Traveling Exhibit volunteers welcome guests into the traveling exhibit in the Tony & Olga Barr Gallery. Volunteers in the Traveling Exhibit may guide guests through exhibit activities. Traveling Exhibit volunteers are comfortable interacting with guests of all ages, including young children.

Rotunda Assistants – Volunteers in the Rotunda are responsible for facilitating one of our lab extensions. Lab extensions are short demonstrations or experiments related to the science of the museum’s current theme. Rotunda volunteers must be comfortable with learning new things, engaging people and initiating interactions with guests, and feel comfortable sharing science concepts and knowledge.

Program Assistants – Volunteers in our weekly programs are responsible for helping the students complete the activities and experiments demonstrated by the instructors. Program volunteers must be comfortable interacting with children.
